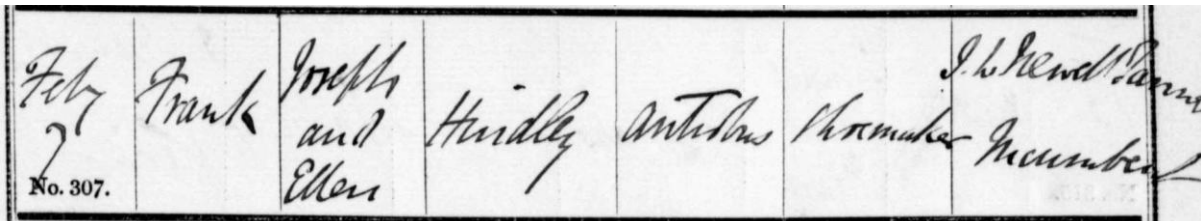

Frank was born at Antrobus, Cheshire, in 1869. His birth was registered at Runcorn, Cheshire, in the first quarter of 1869. He was the third child of Joseph and Ellen Hindley. **GBBBBG**

Frank was baptised at Antrobus Church on 7<sup>th</sup> February 1869.



It is believed that Frank was born at Nook Cottage, Antrobus, and that he lived there until his early 20s, at least.

The **1871 Census** showed that Frank Hindley was aged 2 years, and living with his parents in the Pools Platt area. Nook Cottage was in the Pools Platt area.

At the time of the **1881 Census** Frank was aged 12, a scholar, and living with his parents at Pools Platt, Antrobus.

Frank started his working life by learning the trade of a wheelwright. In the **1891 Census** he was 22 years of age, a wheelwright, and still living with his parents at Pools Platt, Antrobus.

Frank and his parents had left Nook Cottage by the time of the **1901 Census**. Their address was given as Hill Farm, Antrobus. Frank was a wheelwright working from home. Frank's sister, Fanny aged 23, was also at this address.

The **1911 Census** told us that Frank was 41 years old and that he had returned to Nook Cottage. He was still a wheelwright, single, and living on his own.

Later, Frank lived with his sister, Fanny Hindley and her husband Arthur Taylor in Knutsford Road, Antrobus. At the time the house was wooden but on the same site in 1997 there was a brick building.

Frank was a wheelwright by trade but he was also employed as a stopper, blocking fox holes for the Hunt. He was keen on football and was a supporter of Macclesfield Town (his older brother, Edward, had connections with Macclesfield). He also acted as a scout for Northwich Victoria Football Club. Frank used to walk everywhere and particularly to football matches in Northwich. He could be rather bossy but overall he was a nice person.

Frank sported a moustache and this became brown as a result of his constant cigarette smoking. He was a typical poacher who used to set snares and his coats had big pockets for rabbits and game such as pheasants.
