1832 A manuscript written in 1878 by Joseph Hindley (father) lists the birth of Joseph as 21st August 1832. His baptism is recorded in the Chester Bishop’s Transcripts for Great Budworth: “Joseph son of Joseph and Sarah Hindley of Higher Whitley shoemaker baptised September 16th 1832”. **GBBBBGBGGGGGB**

11 of the 14 children reached adulthood.

Joseph was a shoemaker, like his father, and he lived in the Antrobus area all his life. The censuses refer to him living at (or in the area of) Reed House Cottage, Reed House, Pools Platt, and lastly (in 1901) at Hill Farm. He probably (family chat says he did) live at Hammersmith Cottages which are on Pools Platt Lane where Hindleys are known to have lived for many years.

1865 On 8th August 1865 Joseph Hindley, shoemaker, married Ellen Millington at St. Mark’s Church, Antrobus. (Entry no. 36). Ellen’s father, Thomas Millington, was also a shoemaker. The couple wrote their own signatures in the presence of Jane Hindley (*likely to be a younger sister of Joseph*). (*I saw the Antrobus Church Register at Chester Record Office on 4th June 1993*).

Ellen Millington was christened on 21st August 1836 at Great Budworth Church according to Bishops Transcripts. She was the daughter of Thomas (a shoemaker) and Sarah Millington, of Antrobus. The Millington family tree shows that Sarah's maiden name was Miller.

Joseph's younger brother, Jonas, was a wheelwright. Jonas did several jobs for Joseph and a sample is included here from Jonas' Ledgers. (See a photocopy of this part of the ledger on a later page).

1858 In 1858 a Joseph Hindley won second prize for his cow at the Great Budworth Agricultural Show. This category was for people owning one or two cows so the Hindley Dwelling in the area of Reed House cottage must have had land with it. At this time Joseph, aged 26, was living with his parents so the owner of the cow might have been his father, aged 52.

Extract from the Chester Chronicle in 1858.

1858 Great Budworth Agricultural Show

On Thursday, the 16th inst., the seventeenth annual exhibition of stock, horses, etc., etc., Under the auspices of the Great Budworth Agricultural Society, was held in a field adjoining the Cock Inn, Great Budworth. The quantity of stock shown was less than usual as a whole, but the show of bulls and horses was an average, and the quality was good. The number of sheep and pigs was small, but the quality of those exhibited was fair.

MANURES

The Runcorn Bone Works Company had a stand on which were set a variety of manures and fertilisers.

CATTLE

To the labourer in husbandry, and occupier of a cottage whose rent does not exceed £15 per annum, who shall exhibit the best stirk under eighteen months old, such labourer not keeping more than two cows, nor having allowed his cows or stirks to depasture in the lanes or roads, £1 10s; for the second best ditto, £1.

1st Thomas Hewitt, Aston; 2nd Joseph Hindley, Antrobus.

Dictionary definition of a Stirk

A **stirk** is a young bullock or heifer, usually between one and two years old.

1873 In 1873 Joseph Hindley *rented or owned* 2 acres, 3 roods and 34 perches of land in Antrobus with a rateable value of £11-10shillings. Joseph was living at Hammersmith Cottages in 1873.

1903 Ellen died on 21st April 1903, aged 66 years, and was buried at Antrobus Church.

1903 Joseph died a short while later, on 15th June 1903. He was also buried at Antrobus Church.
