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Richard Hindley was born on 30th June 1799 in the Great Budworth area, probably Antrobus. BGBBBBBBBGG His date of marriage to Ann _____ has not yet been found. Richard followed his father in the shoemaking trade and he lived in the Antrobus area all his life.

In **1841** Richard and Ann were living in Whitley Grove, Whitley Superior with four children.

By **1851** Richard was plying his trade in Pepper Street, Appleton. Thomas and Ellen were the only children with their parents at this time.

The **1861** Census shows Richard (62) and Ann (58) having three boys living with them aged 8, 5 and 3. They are listed as sons of Richard (H)Indley. *Most unlikely.*

They were living at Seven Oaks Green, Seven Oaks, Great Budworth.

Who were the father and mother of these three boys?

Richard died on 23rd March 1863 and was buried at Antrobus St. Marks Church on 27th March 1863.

I looked on the internet for the births of James, George and Thomas and found they correlated with the 1861 Census.

James Hindley : Birth registered at Runcorn in 1853 (Q1). (Ref. 8a 189)
George Hindley: Birth registered at Runcorn in 1856 (Q1). (Ref. 8a 187)
Thomas Hindley: Birth registered at Runcorn in 1858 (Q1). (Ref. 8a 181)
(Mothers and fathers were not listed).

I sent for the birth certificate of James (see next page) and found his mother to be Elizabeth Hindley who was, almost certainly, the daughter of Richard Hindley. Elizabeth was born on 3rd February 1835 and would have just reached 18 when James was born. The name of the father has been left blank.


A correspondent solved the mystery of *Richard's sons*. The transcriber had missed a vital G which is shown on the original census sheet. So James, George and Thomas were Richard's grandsons. The father remains unknown.

- 1851 Census** Pepper Street, Appleton. Richard Hindley, shoemaker, aged 51; wife Ann 49; son Thomas, 10; daughter Ellen, 8.
- 1861 Census** Seven Oaks Green, Seven Oaks. (*Between Antrobus and Comberbach*). Richard Hindley aged 62; Ann aged 58; and 3 young children.
- 1863** **Antrobus (St. Marks Church)** Monumental Inscription (H7). Richard Hindley was buried on 27th March 1863, aged 65 years. (*I believe he died on 23rd March 1863*).
- 1867** **Antrobus (St. Marks Church)** Monumental Inscription. Ann, wife of Richard, was buried in the same grave as Richard on 12th February 1867, aged 67 years.

2. 29.08.1830 Hannah baptised at Great Budworth. Daughter of Richard and Anne Hindley of Antrobus. Richard is a shoemaker.
3. 26.01.1834 Sarah baptised at Chapelry of Stretton. Daughter of Richard and Anne Hindley of Higher Whitley. Richard is a shoemaker.
4. 29.03.1835 Elizabeth baptised at Chapelry of Stretton. Daughter of Richard and Anne Hindley of Whitley. Richard is a shoemaker. Born 03.02.1835 (on register).
5. 23.04.1837 Sarah baptised at Chapelry of Stretton. Daughter of Richard and Ann Hindley of Lower Whitley. Richard is a shoemaker. Born 28.02.1837 (on register).
6. 26.05.1839 George christened at Chapelry of Stretton. Son of Richard and Anne Hindley of Higher Whitley. Richard is a shoemaker. Born 28th March 1839.
7. 19.07.1840 Thomas christened at Chapelry of Stretton. Son of Richard and Anne Hindley of Whitley. Richard is a shoemaker. Born 03.06.1840.
8. 19.09.1843 Ellen christened at Stretton. Daughter of Richard and Anne Hindley of Seven Oaks. Richard is a shoemaker. Born 18.08.1843.

What happened to Richard's daughter, Elizabeth?

It looks as though Elizabeth Hindley died in the second quarter of 1858, which would have been soon after the birth of her third son, Thomas. There is no sign of Elizabeth in the 1861 Census.

In 1849 Richard was involved with the Estate of Allen Hewitt, the husband of Richard's sister Margaret. Margaret had died soon after Allen, in October 1849. The transcript of the legal document is shown below.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we **William Hewitt of Appleton [near Warrington] in the County and Diocese of Chester, Farmer, Edward Barker also of the same place, Wheelwright and Richard Hindley also of the same place, Shoemaker** are holden and firmly bound unto the Right Reverend Father in God **John** by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Chester, in the sum of **Four Hundred** Pounds, of good and lawful Money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, current in that part of the said Kingdom called England, to be paid unto the said Lord Bishop, his lawful Attorney, Executors, Administrators or Assigns, to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves and every of us severally for and in the whole, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, of every of us firmly by these Presents, Sealed with our Seals and dated the **thirty first day of October** in the **thirteenth** Year of the Reign of our Sovereign **Lady Victoria** by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland **Queen** Defender of the Faith, and in the Year of our Lord God One thousand eight hundred and **forty nine**.

The Condition of this Obligation is such, that if **the above bounden William Hewitt the natural and lawful son, and one of the next of kin, and Administrator** of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of **Allen Hewitt late of Appleton aforesaid a Farmer, deceased, Margaret Hindley, his widow having since died without administering** to make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of **him** the said **William Hewitt** or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for **his use** and the same so made do exhibit, or came to be exhibited into the Registry of the Consistory Court of Chester, aforesaid at or before **the thirtieth** day of **April** next ensuing. And the same goods, chattels and credits of the same deceased, at the time of **his death** which at any time after shall come to the hands and possession of any other person or persons for **him** do well and truly administer according to law, and further do make a cause to be made, a true and just account of **his** said administration, at or before the **thirty first** day of **October** which shall be in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred **and fifty** and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the same administrator's account, the same being first examined and allowed of by the judge or judges for the time being of the said court, shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively or the said judge or judges by his or their decree, or sentence, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of an Act of Parliament, made in the two-and-twentieth and three-and-twentieth years of the reign of his late Majesty King Charles, the Second, entitled *An Act for the better settling Intestates' Estates*, shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and testament was made by the said deceased, and the executor or executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said court, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said **William Hewitt** above bounden, being thereunto required, do render and deliver the said letters of administration [approbation of such testament being first had and made in the same court] then that obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Page 2 – **The thirty first day of October 1849**

William Hewitt within named took the usual oath of an administrator in common form and also made oath that the personal Estate and Effects of the Intestate within the Diocese of Chester, were under the value of two hundred pounds.

Before me Thos. Lowe – Surrogate.

The Intestate died the eighth day of October 1849
